Class Party Dates for 2023-24

Holiday: Thursday, December 21 st

Class parties are always highly anticipated by kids, and parents can help to make them memorable while keeping extra effort in check. You might be wondering what your role is, what the first step might be, or how you can help. Here's a basic breakdown:

Room Parents:

Start by talking with your teacher to get their thoughts on what works. Sometimes a simple approach is best. Then, reach out to your Key Volunteers to delegate responsibilities such as décor, games, craft, and food. Finally, send a message to the parents in your class letting them know the date and basic plan for the party, and requesting contributions for party expenses. Your teacher might also send this message on your behalf.

One additional note: in some cases, all Room Parents from a grade work together on a party, especially the end-of-year celebration. You can always reach out your co-Room Parents to see if they are interested in collaborating.

Key Volunteers:

Key Volunteers signed up at the beginning of the school year to be helping hands for their Room Parents. Think this might be you but not sure? Check with your Room Parent, who will have a list. Not sure who your Room Parent is? Ask your teacher.

As class parties approach, consider specific ways you'd like to support your Room Parent. Look ahead at your schedule and determine which parties you can most easily help with. Sometimes Key Volunteers take on lead coordinating roles when Room Parents aren't available.

All Other Parents:

Keep an eye out for communication from your Room Parent or teacher about party dates, and information on how you can make a contribution to help pay for the party. And remember, you can always offer to step in and help with a game, craft, or anything else you think might make the party fun!

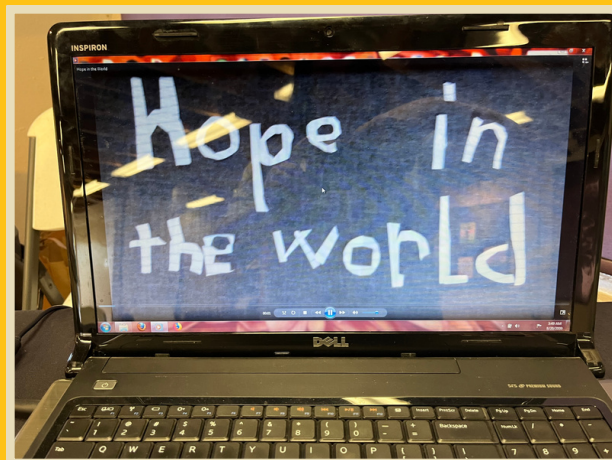

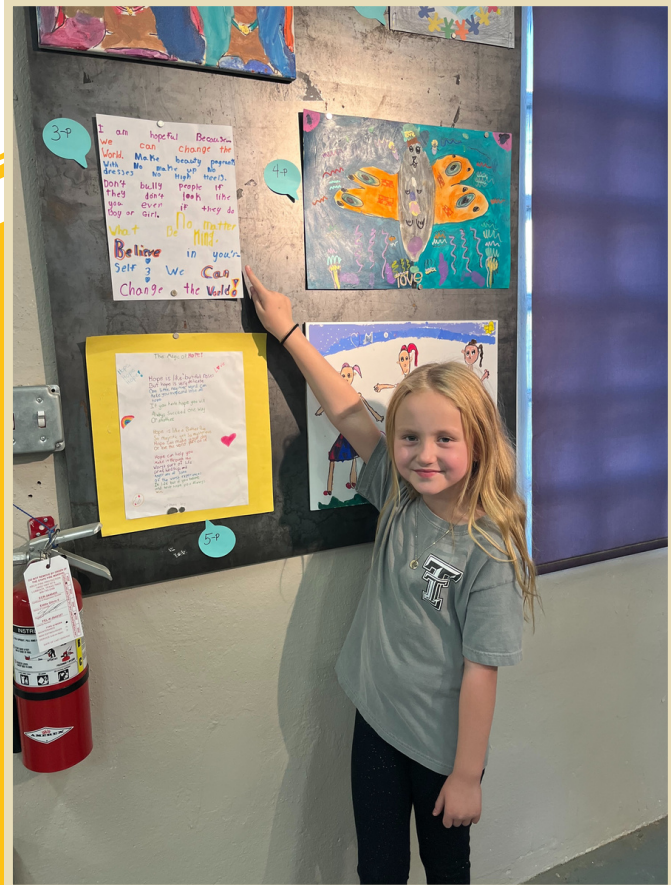
