It was a busy week at River and an exciting week for Shark Athletes. Our **Girls Softball** team won a **DISTRICT championship**, as did our **Boys Volleyball** and **Boys Track** Teams. Our **Girls Track Team** was district runner up. We also had a state singles finalist for **GIRLS TENNIS** and our doubles team ended up state semifinalists. Please read the entire callout for important upcoming testing dates. We have BIG PM3 (GRADUATION REQUIREMENT) tests this week for 9th and 10th graders in addition to several AP and AICE exams. Students need to read their emails and follow directions in the morning to ensure they are where they need to be on time. Remember students you need a FULLY CHARGED district device for PM3. All 10th grade students will be taking this exam starting at 7:30am on May 7th. All 9th grade students will be taking this exam on May 9th starting at 7:30am. (Note students with AICE exams on the same day will take their AICE exams and makeup PM3 later this week-see your emails from Mrs.Terry, testing coordinator)

Seniors - here are some very important announcements for this upcoming week:

- Our annual **Senior Awards Night** is tomorrow, Monday, May 6th at 6pm in the theater. Students receiving awards were emailed invitations. Please be sure to check your school email account. Parents and guardians are welcome to attend. We look forward to seeing everyone there to help celebrate our outstanding seniors.
- **Senior checkout** is scheduled for Tuesday, May 7 all day in the theater. Schedules for when students should report were shared with students earlier in April.
- **Herff Jones** made its last on-campus appearance this week. Did your graduating senior remember to get their cap and gown taken care of during any of their stops on campus this year? If not and your senior is still in need of their cap and gown, they can still purchase one. This **Wednesday, May 8, students can go to Herff Jones' Lake Worth office to purchase. Students it's TIME, Cambridge exams have begun. Please read below and take the necessary actions to ensure your SUCCESS on these important exams!

Students taking Cambridge Exams, please see below for some VERY IMPORTANT INSTRUCTIONS AND INFORMATION:

- Please be sure you are checking the **Grade Level Cambridge Google Classroom** for exam locations and seat assignments. **Assignments will be posted at least 3-4 days prior to your exam date.**
- **BE ON TIME!** Please **be sure you are reporting** for testing at **7:30am for all AM exams and 11:30am for all PM exams.**
- For **exams taking place in classrooms**, you will **report directly to those rooms at the times noted.** For **exams taking place in the Media Center or Gym**, you will **line-up in the courtyard by the sign associated with your row.**
- **COME PREPARED!** First and foremost, this means you need to have your **Student Photo ID worn on your person.** In addition, you **must also have any item your teacher has instructed you to bring (i.e. pencils, pens, rulers, etc...).** *****Calculators may be used unless you are told otherwise for your exam, however YOU MAY NOT USE ANY OTHER DEVICE WITH A CALCULATOR FUNCTION.*****
- **BE ACADEMICALLY HONEST AND ETHICAL!**
- You are expected not to engage in any unfair or dishonest practices before, during, or after the exam.
- You are not permitted to sit for an exam in the name of another candidate.
- Other prohibited items include electronic devices, mobile phones, or any other equipment that may allow you an unfair advantage.
- **FOLLOW ALL INSTRUCTIONS.** You are expected to follow all instructions given by invigilators, proctors, and anyone else involved in the administration of the exam.
- **ALL EXAM MATERIALS MUST BE LEFT BEHIND.** All exam materials (including question papers, answer books, answer paper, rough/scratch work, and any other **USED OR UNUSED** materials, must be left in the exam room.
 - If any of the above rules or expectations are not followed, you may be penalized or disqualified from the examination and your exam may not be scored,

WE KNOW you are going to be well prepared to show **WHAT YOU KNOW!**

We have hit the testing season at full speed and our students are doing **AMAZING** so far being prepared to test! **If you would like your child dismissed AFTER an exam is over because you've decided that it is okay for them to miss their other classes, you MUST fill out the google form posted in that course's google classroom by their teacher.** By completing the early release Google Form for testing (located at the end of this section of the callout), you are stating that your child may be released from school once they have been dismissed from their AP/AICE/EOC exam. If you have more than one child, this form must be completed for each child. **This Google Form is NOT for non-testers.** Same procedures follow for non-testers to leave campus, parents call their alpha suite and students pick up passes and leave at bell changes.

Parents must upload the completed Early Release Verification Form that requires a parent signature for the student to be released. Students listed with approval to leave campus after the exam will receive a dismissal pass on the day of the test. It will either be given to them at the end of their test session if possible OR they may pick it up from their Suite. Suite Blue (Last Name A-K) or Suite Silver (Last Name L-Z). **This form MUST be completed for each day that you are requesting to have your child released after their test.** Filling out the form once does NOT allow the students to be released for multiple days. Forms MUST be filled out by 5 PM each day the day before testing (starts Monday afternoon for Tuesday's test).

FAST & EOC's will start on May 7th. FAST ELA Progress Monitoring 3 (graduation requirement). All **10th grade students** will be taking this exam starting at **7:30am** on May 7th. All **9th grade students** will be taking this exam on May 9th starting at **7:30am**.

The schedule of upcoming EOCs is as follows:

- **US History EOC** will be on **May 8th** starting at **7:30am**.
- **Biology EOC** will be on **May 15th** starting at **7:30am**.
- **Algebra and Geometry EOC** will be **May 20th**.

Students taking either **AP or AICE exams** on these days **MUST** take their AP or AICE exams that day. PM 3 or EOC exams will need to be made up during the make-up period, which starts on May 10th. Please check school emails for dates, time, and locations for make-up exams. Keep in mind - **EOCs are 30% of a student's final grade** in a course and should be taken very seriously. Attached below are links to our parent testing calendar; this calendar includes dates for other tests. Your children have known these dates for months ! On the select days mentioned above, all students that are not testing and are on campus will be held in a holding room until testing is complete.

the Google Classroom for Algebra EOC review using the code js4kxcj. Please make arrangements for students to be picked-up.

The **Geometry EOC** exam on Monday, May 20th is quickly approaching. The EOC is 30% of the full-year Geometry grade. Students must score at a level 3 to pass the exam. The Geometry team will be holding after school EOC review sessions on Thursdays after school from 3:00 pm to 4:00 pm. Students will meet in room 8-126 (Miss LaBelle's classroom) where they will be split into two review groups with a geometry teacher. Students can also join the **Google Classroom for Geometry review** where we will post the materials we are using in these review sessions. The code for the Google Classroom is: **mwoq34t**.
